2/24/2015	Town Council	Town Hall	<p>Town Council discussed their individual goals and overall desire to restore necessary services and established the following general priorities for the upcoming fiscal year:</p> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> • Set aside matching funds for grant(s) for plans for a commercial sewer project. • Maintain economic viability of Downtown Paradise. Septic systems are predicted to fail within ten years which would effectively destroy the economic viability of many downtown businesses.
9/8/2015	Town Council	Town Hall	<p>Authorized the Town Manager to enter into a one-year Partnership Investment Agreement with 3Core. A partnership with 3Core is a requirement for applying to EDA and other grants which could provide funding for a sewer and other projects.</p> <p>Vice Mayor Jones presented information at the 9/1/2015 Chico City Council meeting regarding the Town’s desire to include a pipeline to the Chico plant as a feasible wastewater disposal alternative for the purpose of applying for grant monies for an environmental study. The Chico City Council indicated that they might schedule this item on a future agenda for discussion.</p>
11/10/2015	Town Council	Town Hall	<p>Vice Mayor Jones reported on the results of the 11/3/2015 Chico City Council Meeting. V-M Jones presented a request from the Paradise Town Council to approve a concept for a sewer pipe from Paradise to the Chico Water Pollution Control Plant in order that the Town may include the proposal as an option when requesting grant funding. The request was approved by a 5-2 vote, Ritter and Schwab dissenting. The two dissenters stated that their concerns relate to potential growth inducement and the lack of information and unanswered questions. The next steps are to seek funding. The Town has a grant in progress and some funding will have to come in the form of a loan.</p>
12/8/2015	Town Council	Town Hall	<p>Approved staff pursuit of a wastewater (sewer) solution for a portion of the Town.</p> <p>Following a report from Town Manager Gill regarding the application to the Clean Water State Revolving Fund for a \$500,000 grant for the Paradise Community Wastewater Project, Mayor Jones opened the matter for public comment:</p> <ol style="list-style-type: none"> 1. Jon Remalia stated that he is both a property owner and occupant of business property that will be served by the proposed sewer, that Proposition 218 states that those who benefit from an assessment district are the ones who will be paying for the benefit, that the Town already has an onsite fee for 11,000 parcels, that he thinks onsite money should not be used to serve a small portion of the community, and that he would like a benefit district to be established before moving forward with the project. Mr. Remalia also stated that he thinks there would be better opportunity to have the project funded if it included recycling and reclaiming. 2. Richard Harriman stated that he represents himself as a Chico taxpayer and the Northern California Defense Center, is

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			<p>addressing the Paradise Council because Paradise addressed the Chico City Council, that he is not in favor of a pipe to Chico as the preferred alternative, and if residential is included in the district, he thinks that the Paradise General Plan will have to undergo a comprehensive update, and that he hopes the citizens will be included in the planning process.</p> <p>Town Council adopted Resolution No 15-53 as amended, A Resolution Approving a Financial Assistance Application (\$500,000 Grant) for a Financing Agreement from the State Water Resources Control Board Relating to the Planning, Design, and Construction of the Paradise Community Wastewater Project.</p>

1/25/2016	Town Council	Town Hall	<p>Staff will be bringing a mid-year budget report to the 2/9/2016 Town Council meeting with the budget schedule and announced that the Town received a \$500,000 grant for the sewer project feasibility and analysis study.</p>

Pamela Teeter, Vice President of the Chamber of Commerce, spoke in support of the sewer project both as a business owner and as the Paradise Chamber representative. <p>Town Council concurred with staff's recommendation of Bennett Engineering Services to perform the "Alternatives Analysis, Feasibility Report and Special District Formation Services for the Paradise Sewer Project" and approved the Professional Services Agreement with Bennett Engineering Services.</p>

There were approximately 79 people in attendance at the meeting.</p> <p>At the meeting, a formal presentation covered information on Project status, proposed service area, anticipated flows, funding structures, and next steps was given. After the presentation was complete, the engineering consulting team and Town of Paradise staff answered questions in an open forum. Attendee questions ranged in topic from pump station type and location, service area finalization, Project timeline, and property values. While some answers were straight forward, many were yet to be determined since the Project is still in early stages.</p> <p>After the open question and answer period was completed, meeting attendees were encouraged to review the exhibits on display and ask further questions of Town and consultant staff.</p> <p>Attendees were provided with a copy of the presentation, fact sheet, and a comment card when they signed into the meeting.</p>

2/28/2017	Town Council	Paradise Performing Arts Center	<p>Mayor Lotter announced that the Draft Sewer Report would be presented by Bennett Engineering. There will be no decisions made tonight by the Town Council. There will be a 30-day review and comment period with several opportunities for the public to address the Town Council about the project. The consultants provided five options for consideration:</p> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> a. Localized Wastewater Treatment Plant with Effluent Land Application b. Localized Wastewater Treatment Plant with Surface Water Discharge Location c. Regional Connection to the City of Chico Water Pollution Control Plant d. Wastewater Treatment with Beneficial Reuse. e. No Project. <p>The feasibility study identified the best long-term solution for the Town as Option C due to life cycle cost, environmental impacts, public impacts and long-term operational burden. This option requires negotiations with the City of Chico to attain a memorandum of understanding before moving forward. This was only the recommendation by the consultants; nothing has been approved at this time.</p> <p>There was a question-and-answer session after the presentation which will be included in the Final Sewer Report.</p> <p>The public comment period will be open to the public until March 31, 2017 at which time all comments and suggestions will be incorporated into the final report.</p>
3/14/17	Town Council	Town Hall	Announced that there will be a drop-in Sewer Workshop on March 22 nd at Town Hall from 4-7 p.m.

During the public comment period, Ward Habriel commented that the information is good, but there are still a lot of questions from citizens and recommended a short statement to inform people of the necessity/benefits of a sewer system.
6/13/2017	Town Council	Town Hall	Town Engineer Marc Mattox provided an update on the Paradise Sewer Project. The final report and staff recommendation will be presented at the July 11, 2017 Town Council meeting which will be held at the Paradise Performing Arts Center.
7/11/2017	Town Council	Paradise Performing Arts Center	<p>Mike Massaro from Bennett Engineering provided a brief presentation on the Sewer Project, including the five options that were analyzed. Town Manager Lauren Gill thanked all the participants in the study and reviewed the economic benefits to the entire region and community, both commercial and residential. Town Engineer Marc Mattox provided an overview of the staff recommendations which included the following:</p> <ol style="list-style-type: none"> 1. Acknowledge and accept Bennett Engineering’s Town of Paradise Sewer Project, Alternatives Analysis and Feasibility Report: Determining a Preferred Option for Implementation; and, 2. Concur with staff recommendation to: <ol style="list-style-type: none"> a. Select the Direct Connection to the City of Chico Water Pollution Control Plant alternative as the preferred alternative. b. Commence efforts with the City of Chico to determine with certainty if they are willing to negotiate a regional connection. c. Defer Special Assessment District Formation until adequate funding has been secured for construction of the selected alternative. d. Engage state and federal representatives on project need and alternative grant funding options. e. Secure additional grant funding for preliminary design and environmental studies. <p>The following public comments were received:</p> <ol style="list-style-type: none"> 1. Ward Habriel – stated that there are not enough people in attendance to get the message out, would like a positive message to the community, current businesses have made an investment in the community with engineered systems, how do you convince other businesses that they need to invest in a sewer system, where does wastewater go and how will the lack of wastewater impact the trees/plants/environment? 2. Monty Knittel, President/CEO of Feather River Hospital – stated that his main concern is health care, wants this to be a thriving community and to be able to recruit talented employees - supports the project. 3. Matt Miller – had questions regarding the right of way area, if everyone could pay for the sewer system even if they weren’t in the assessment district and if there would be an impact to development fees – supports a regional connection.

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			<p>Staff informed Mr. Miller that his questions would be answered later in the process during the engineering or other phases of the project, that it was not legal to have citizens pay who were not in the district and it is not clear yet what development impacts there will be.</p> <p>4. Martin Nichols - inquired as to what Chico's terms would be before moving forward and suggested keeping the local option.</p> <p>5. Kelly Serl – has been personally impacted by the rising water table, problem will not go away, is affecting the entire community and property values, not just proposed district, make sure if money is spent that it will provide a benefit for the entire community and stated that Butte County will no longer be operating a wastewater treatment center (septage receiving station) as of September 1, 2017 and encouraged everyone to be prepared.</p> <p>6. Jim Harding – pointed out that this sewer system will maintain septic tanks if you already have one or need to add one and inquired about the suggested cost in the report and why the funding amount was higher.</p> <p>Staff stated that the interest for financing the project is what raised the cost.</p> <p>Council Member Jones stated she did not support the staff recommendation as written because Chico is in the middle of studying their wastewater system and may not be willing/able to participate in the project. She then suggested two changes to the staff recommendation, Sections A and B (changes are reflected in the motion below).</p> <p>Council Member Schuster concurred with Vice Mayor Jones and stated that two options make sense, suggested a change to Section C to say, "identified" instead of "secured," suggested that there could be other opportunities within the area and would like to refer to the project as a Wastewater system, not a sewer system.</p> <p>Mayor Lotter concurred with the alternative options choice, thinks there's an advantage to the local discharge option, and informed the citizens that the Butte County Board of Supervisors will be closing the septage receiving facility portion of the Neal Road Landfill leaving the closest septic receiving station in Lincoln.</p> <p>Town Council approved the following:</p> <ol style="list-style-type: none"> 1. Acknowledge and accept Bennett Engineering's Town of Paradise Sewer Project, Alternatives Analysis and Feasibility Report: Determining a Preferred Option for Implementation; and, 2. Modified the staff recommendations to take the following actions: <ol style="list-style-type: none"> a. Select the Direct Connection to the City of Chico Water Pollution Control Plant and a wastewater treatment plant, with or without reuse, as

She stated that the meetings with state representatives look promising that we will get funding for the environmental phase. The alternative plans include connecting to Chico's wastewater system or building our own wastewater system.

5/14/2019	Town Council	Town Hall	<p>Assistant Town Manager Marc Mattox gave an overview on the proposed Sewer Project and revisited the 2017 Paradise Sewer Project Feasibility Report. The different phases of the project were highlighted which included the Feasibility Report, Environmental Review, Design, Right of Way and Construction. Staff asked council to decide on a wastewater option of either a regional connection with the City of Chico or a local treatment plant.</p> <p>Council Member Crowder commented that using the local option allows us to control our own destiny.</p> <p>Council Member Schuster asked if the local option is chosen whether there are public or private companies that can maintain the treatment plant. Assistant Town Manager Mattox stated there are companies that can maintain the treatment plant.</p> <p>Council Member Schuster commented that previously the local option was not as feasible due to the lack of available land for the treatment plant, but the current availability of land has made this option more viable.</p> <p>Mayor Jones explained a conversation she had with Dustin Cooper, the legal counsel for Paradise Irrigation District (PID): Mr. Cooper stated the sewer coincides with a project that PID is working on in which a pipeline would be built to Chico. PID is hopeful that the Council will pick the regional option. While the</p>

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			<p>pipes need to be built 10 feet apart, PID believes there could be cost savings if the projects are built simultaneously. The following public comments were made:</p> <ol style="list-style-type: none"> 1. Ward Habriel is concerned that funds for the Sewer would detract from potential spending on public safety and that public safety should be the Towns number one priority. 2. Steve Culleton disliked the idea of doing the regional option to Chico and encouraged Council to vote for the local option. 3. Theresa McDonald is concerned that if there is pipeline built to Chico, then they have the ability to shut off that pipeline and the sewage would have no place to go. She stated that the right of way will cost less, is worried about not having storage in case the pipe breaks and that having a local treatment plant can produce grey water which can potentially help fight fires. 4. Cliff Jacobson is for the regional option. Mr. Jacobson stated that he knows Chico has adequate capacity to accommodate Paradise sewage, does not believe that Chico will cut the line because that is what we have contracts and attorneys for. He believes CAL Water has a large interest in getting the PID water to Chico and will help us build our sewer line to Chico as well. <p>Town Council selected the local treatment plant option for the purposes of securing funding for preliminary engineering work (environmental review, project design and right of way).</p>

Due to the variability of the funding.</p> <ol style="list-style-type: none"> 1. Tom Kelly spoke on his experience in putting a treatment center in South Lake Tahoe. 2. Steve Culleton stated that the public would like to know where the sewer treatment is planned to be. <p>Town Council directed staff to entertain a Design-Build process, to consider the vicinities that are included in the feasibility study and to proceed with the RFP.</p>

12/8/2020	Town Council	Town Hall	<p>Public Works Director/Town Engineer Marc Mattox and HDR Engineer John Buttz provided Town Council with an update on the preliminary engineering and environmental review work of the proposed Paradise Sewer Project.</p> <p>Ward Habriel submitted an email comment which stated that he supports a treatment plant within the Town but thinks the regional option with Chico will be too expensive and that there aren't enough businesses to support it.</p> <p>Town Council then:</p> <ol style="list-style-type: none"> 1. Acknowledged the findings and recommendations made by HDR Engineering in consideration of their Phase 1 Preliminary Engineering and Environmental Review work of the proposed Paradise Sewer Project; and 2. Acknowledged a letter from Central Valley Regional Water Quality Control Board dated November 4, 2020 in consideration of their independent evaluation of wastewater treatment options for the Town of Paradise; and 3.
